Etiquette on the green

Green etiquette is a combination of good manners, sportsmanship and sociability...

- 1. Be conversant with the laws of the game and observe them.
- 2. Be punctual for matches and come correctly attired.
- 3. Keep quiet and refrain from moving when players are on the mat.
- 4. Stand behind the mat when opponents are bowling.
- 5. Always stand still in the head when a player is about to bowl.
- 6. Walk close to the centre of the rink with minimum delay when changing ends, as you could distract play on the next rink.
- 7. Keep track of play and be ready to bowl when it is your turn.
- 8. Never deliver your bowl before the previous bowl has come to rest.
- 9. Avoid interfering with the head until the result of the end has been agreed by the vices (number 2's in triples or number 3's in rinks).
- 10. Bowlers not pushing the woods back after an end should assist to make pushing them easier and faster.
- 11. Never complain about lucky bowls, they tend to equal each other out over a season.
- 12. Respect the green surface at all times. Never drop woods on the green.
- 13. Do not criticise the playing surface when playing away games.
- 14. Do not criticise the performance of other players. Nobody plays a bad bowl on purpose.
- 15. Inform your opponent and skip if you wish to leave the green.
- 16. If you lose, be a good loser. Don't blame other people, the green or the weather conditions.
- 17. All bowlers should remember to help clear the equipment from the rink after the game.
- 18. Always shake hands with and thank your opponents after the game.
